kansas logistics park

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To support growing industries, the City of Newton has set aside over 400 acres for the development of the Kansas Logistics Park. Located in south central Kansas, the park has immediate access to major interstates, railways and air transportation, making it unlike any other location in the Midwest.

Nearly \$15 million has been invested in the park's infrastructure, with city-owned water and sewer mains, as well as lead rail improvements, in place. With shovel-ready sites and a skilled workforce at hand, the Kansas Logistics Park is primed to serve the needs of agriculture, energy and manufacturing clients.

GLOBAL ACCESS,PRIME LOCATION

Centrally located in the U.S., Newton is a unique community with space to expand and unrivaled access to a myriad of transportation avenues — giving manufacturers a distinct competitive advantage in distributing their products to the world.

AGRICULTURE

The state of Kansas is a leader in agriculture, with abundant resources such as land, water, and a deeply rooted knowledge of agricultural practices. Our state is a natural choice to address the unprecedented global demand for food, which is projected to double by 2050.

MANUFACTURING

We are becoming one of the lowest cost producers in the developed world. When adjusting for productivity, the average labor costs in other developed countries are 20%–45% higher than those in the U.S. With a sizeable workforce in the immediate area and a desire to create jobs on American soil, the Kansas Logistics Park is dedicated to fostering manufacturing growth right here in the Midwest.



ENERGY

Likewise, the domestic and global demand for energy resources is swelling. Both the trucking and rail industries are moving from diesel to liquid natural gas (LNG), increasing demand for natural gas by more than 60% through 2040. Central Kansas is home to an extensive natural gas pipeline network that can meet these increasing needs.

We also provide a valuable resource in the storage and transportation of manufactured products and commodities such as liquid natural gas, petroleum, and agricultural products. Manufacturers using the Kansas Logistics Park can provide components in a just-in-time manner using delivery-on-demand services. The park will enable manufacturers to reduce fees associated with shipping delays and increase efficiency in the delivery of products.

A READY WORKFORCE

There are over 1,000 manufacturers with a total of 61,000 manufacturing employees and 30,300 aircraft workers within a 50-mile radius of the Kansas Logistics Park. Simply put, no other place in the Midwest has the abundance of qualified workers, suppliers, tier-1 and tier-2 manufacturers, OEMs and aircraft companies than south central Kansas. Our region's longstanding tradition in manufacturing — particularly in the aircraft industry — provides you with access to a world-class workforce that can readily transition into and meet the exacting standards of any industry.

IN TRANSYSTEMS CENTROIDAL ANALYSIS

In 2011, TranSystems completed a study to determine the Kansas Logistics Park's potential to support industry development. A number of key factors were identified and weighted in importance, including: proximity to market/supply; access to intermodal transportation infrastructure; workforce; real estate costs; and federal, state and local incentives.

The Kansas Logistics Park ranked number one when evaluated with comparable sites in terms of single-site locations, dual-site locations and supplier locations near OEM's.
