We were all facing the same unknowns when it came to COVID-19, but thanks to great leadership and support throughout Harvey County and Kansas, we survived.

For the HCEDC Covid-19 meant staying open while other facilities worked from home or closed, to ensure businesses had a point of contact for information and questions. It meant surveys and increased calls to our manufacturers to find out what their needs were and determine ways to assist. It meant understanding each new program that was introduced to assist employers and making sure our manufacturing base had the opportunity to apply. It meant an intentional pivot and focus to make sure all of our manufacturers were still here when the pandemic came to an end. And to this goal, I am proud to say, we were successful.

I feel fortunate to have been the HCEDC Board President during this time, as I was able to witness our County unite and support each other like never before. When I first joined the HCEDC, the slogan was "Stronger Together." I believe that to be even more true today. We are lucky to have great leadership and a strong, county-wide economic development organization that works closely within our larger region. BUSINESS RETENTION

In 2017, HCEDC made a deliberate decision to prioritize existing Harvey County Manufacturers.

At that time we began a formalized retention program to ensure that companies who have already made the commitment to locate in Harvey County are happy and healthy. While we still strongly recruit new investment, we also cultivate growth from within. The relationships built since the start of our retention program have proven invaluable throughout the past year and allowed us to easily communicate with the manufacturing base during the pandemic. In addition to our formalized retention program, the HCEDC communicated through multiple surveys, emails, and phone calls to discuss COVID-19. From making hand sanitizer, purchasing sewing machines and material to make masks rather than laying off employees, to inventing unique face shields for medical professionals, our manufacturers have proven themselves as resilient and resourceful. We are grateful for all of the businesses that call Harvey County home.

HCEDC conducted 47 retention visits with 33 local companies either by phone interviews, zoom calls, or in-person meetings.

HCEDC along with our local employers, teachers, and parents, celebrated these students' success during a signing day at Newton High School. PANDEMIC RESPONSE EFFORTS

HCEDC worked both reactively and proactively with our partners within Harvey County to address the challenges created by COVID-19.

SPRING 2020

Harvey County created an Incident Plan and assigned emergency support functions.

HCEDC led ESF-14 which focused on long-term economic recovery.

HCEDC partnered with the Newton and Hesston Chambers of Commerce, and the Newton Convention and Visitors' Bureau to send out a COVID impact survey assessment.

Business outreach to provide information on PPP loans, EDIL loans, PPE, etc.

SUMMER 2020

Harvey County created the Harvey County CARES Committee. This was a 7 person committee created to assist in the distribution of the \$7M of CARES Act Funding dedicated to Harvey County. The HCEDC represented Business and Industry within this group. Needs assessments for HC CARES funds were submitted and the Committee worked to create program buckets, qualifications, and dollar amounts for each sector represented.

The CARES Committee worked to assist in finalizing the County's Direct Aid Plan.

FALL 2020

The Harvey County Commission and the CARES Committee established six grant programs to distribute CARES funds.

Public Health Grant • Community Support Grant • Community Testing • Private Schools and Colleges • Long-Term Care Support • Senior Center Sustainment The County partnered with the Community Foundation to help with the grant application process and the CARES Committee assisted in reviewing applications.

Funds were awarded and distributed to eligible applicants.

WINTER 2020 - PRESENT

HCEDC worked with local partners for coordinated vaccine clinics for our manufacturing community.


As restrictions have lifted, HCEDC is working closely with our local industry to address on-going challenges to businesses following the pandemic.
